# Virtual Event: El 1er Congreso ALVO y la volcanología en el actual contexto Latinoamericano (The First ALVO Congress and volcanology in the current Latin American context)

- November 26, 2019 hosted by Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM)
- ~110 participants (Latin America, USA, Europe)
- *Main focus*: discuss aspects of disaster risk reduction in the context of Latin America
- Motivation: cases like Fuego 2018 in Guatemala, in which the conflict of the "guerrillas" caused the relocating of the population without knowing the hazards; 1982 - Chichón volcano - bad management led to territorial conflicts.



# Virtual Event: El 1er Congreso ALVO y la volcanología en el actual contexto Latinoamericano (The First ALVO Congress and volcanology in the current Latin American context)

• The event demonstrated the interest in continuing dialogue and of generating more opportunities to reflect on these topics as part of ALVO's agenda.

 ALVO is serving as a platform to motivate and create strategies of collaboration among volcanologists of Latin America and social researchers and colleagues dedicated to risk management.






## First ALVO Congress

- First international conference held completely in virtual modality (changed in 10 days)
- 5 thematic sessions, divided in 30 scientific sections, with over 200 presentations (poster, oral, and plenary talks), as well as a photograph exhibit and a forum (Foro ALVO)
- Working group: 21 people, in charge of hosting the 7 virtual rooms
- Each day hosted up to 200 participants simultaneously among the virtual rooms; the peak in audience was for the 2 plenary talks, with an audience of ~145 participants.
- The success of the events is an example of the strong ties of Latin American collaboration and interest in the development of volcanology.

## Since the First ALVO Congress...

- ALVO demonstrated its capacity to adapt to the changes and situations that arose.
  - Virtual activities in recent years:
    - 2019: 1 event
    - o 2020: 7 events, 1390 participants
    - 2021: 13 events, 1689 participants
    - Another 11 virtual events were supported or hosted by ALVO.
    - Varied in duration from a few hours to events lasting a week.







- Proposals must represent original and unpublished works
- · Abstracts must have a maximum length of 700 words. They can be presented in English or Spanish.
- The manuscript must follow the requirements established by REDER.
- The final manuscript must be submitted with an abstract and keywords in Spanish and English. The main text can be in Spanish or English.

Full paper submission deadline: August 30, 2022

• Deadline on which the authors will receive the manuscript review: December 30, 2022

. Maximum date in which the work will be accepted with all the corrections and editorial comments made: May 15, 2023

Special Issue publication: July 1, 2023

Once the final work is accepted, it can be preliminarily published in the Ahead-of-Print format until its final publication.

Who can submit?

We welcome contributions from sociologists, anthropologists, geographers, social workers, geologists, volcanologists, practitioners, psychologists, health workers, risk managers, stakeholder, decision makers among other disciplines who are focused on volcanic risk reduction and socio-environmental relationships. Contributions from NGOs, volcanological observatories, Civil Protection and community organizations or other nonacademic fields are especially welcome.
